

A BEAR CREEK DOG PARK

AT A GLANCE: *25 fenced acres *separate fenced small dog area *creek access *bag dispensers *trash cans *rinse area *rest rooms *dog drinking water *some shade

Main ¾ mile loop trail plus several other trails, benches, picnic tables. The Dog Park is within Bear Creek Regional Park, with playing fields, playgrounds, picnic areas, community gardens, trails, and free Bear Creek Nature Center. (Note: Some sections of Bear Creek trails, specifically, those around the Nature Center, are closed to dogs and horses. Watch for detour signs on trails).

Directions: From Hwy 24 heading west, turn south (L) on 21st St., drive 1.3 miles, turn west (R) into park at the light at Rio Grande.

B CHEYENNE MEADOWS DOG PARK

AT A GLANCE: *fenced *bag dispensers *trash can, *bench *no rest rooms *no water

Small fenced dog area is on the south side of Cheyenne Meadows Park, adjacent to Otero Elementary School. There is adequate parking.

Directions: South on Nevada (115), east on Cheyenne Meadows Rd, R on Eastmeadow Dr, R on Glenmeadow to Cheyenne Meadows Park.

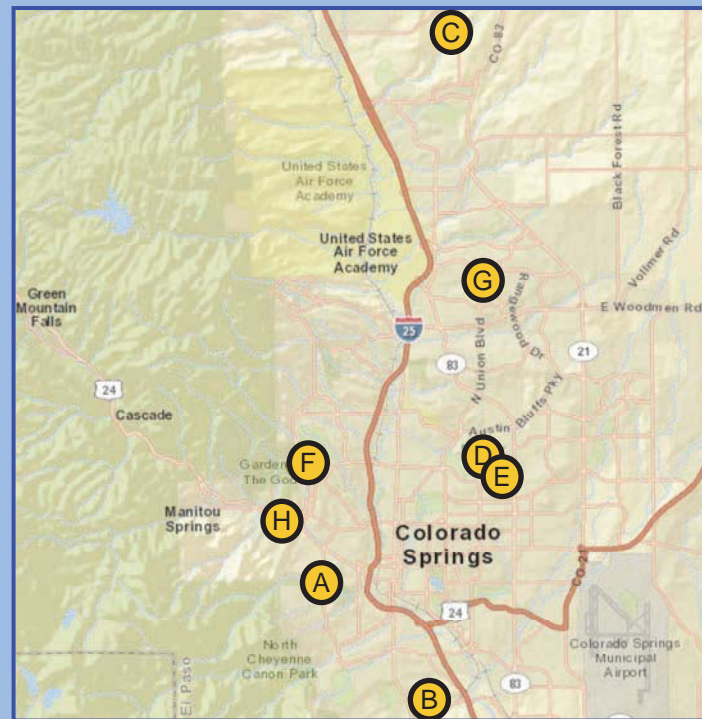
C FOX RUN DOG PARK

AT A GLANCE: *5 fenced acres *bag dispensers *trash cans *benches *entrance vestibule *loop trail *shade

Located in 412-acre Fox Run Regional Park, the region's newest dog park is planned officially opened to the public in 2013.

Directions: Located in the southeast corner near Stella and Roller Coaster Roads, accessed from main park entrance off of Stella Drive. Enter park, take first right and continue straight, south of the active use fields.

D PALMER PARK DOG PARK

AT A GLANCE: *enclosed *tree trunk seats *bag dispenser *water dispenser (summer) *no shade

Enter the park from Maizeland; pass Meadows parking and continue .3 miles to old baseball field.

Directions: From Academy, turn west onto Maizeland to enter Palmer Park.

E PALMER PARK OFF-LEASH AREA

AT A GLANCE: *not enclosed, *largest off-leash area in the county *bag dispenser *shade *benches *trash cans *incredible views

Upper mesa of Ute Crest in northern end of park. Accessible only by trail – good parking Lot #24.

F GARDEN OF THE GODS OFF-LEASH AREA

AT A GLANCE: *unfenced *flat, open area *no facilities *bordered by a high-traffic road

Off-leash area is north of Chambers Way, south of Gateway Road, west of 30th Street and east of Rock Ledge Ranch Historic Site, next to Garden of the Gods Park, which allows dogs on up to 6-foot leashes on any designated trail. Within the park are rest rooms, picnic areas and a Visitor's Center. Dogs are not allowed at Rock Ledge Ranch.

Directions: Enter Park at main entrance off of 30th St. Take first left into Rock Ledge Ranch parking area.

G RAMPART DOG PARK

AT A GLANCE: *fenced *bag dispenser *trash cans *water bowl *parking *little shade *agility equipment *benches

Popular fenced park within Rampart Park is large and flat. Fun agility obstacles are built into the landscape. Bring your own water for the community bowl.

Directions: Located in Rampart Park north of the intersection of Union and Lexington, just past the high school.

H RED ROCK CANYON OPEN SPACE OFF-LEASH

AT A GLANCE: *unfenced *bag dispensers *trash cans *portable toilet

Within the Open Space's 785 acres is an off-leash, unfenced dog area containing two loop trails. From the east end of main parking lot, head up Mesa Trail to reach Lower Dog Loop (1/2 mile RT) and Upper Dog Loop (1 mile RT). *Dogs must be on leash in all Open Space areas except Dog Loops – including parking lot and Mesa Trail access.*

Directions: Turn south onto Ridge Rd. from Hwy 24, just west of Hwy 24 and S. 31st St.

Dog Park Off-Leash Rules (City)

- Dog must be under control with voice commands
- Clean up after your dog!
- Dispose of poop bags in trash cans; don't leave them on the trail.
- Dogs must be accompanied by a person at least 16 years of age.
- Dogs must be leashed until inside enclosures, if park is enclosed.
- No more than 3 dogs per person.
- Dogs with history of aggression must wear a muzzle.
- Owners are responsible and liable for the actions of their dogs at all times.

Check the signs at each park for other rules.

Dogs must be on leash unless in designated areas.



On-Leash rules

- Control your dog when meeting humans, other dogs, horses and wildlife.
- Stay on developed trails.
- Clean up after your dog!
- Owners are responsible and liable for the actions of their dogs at all times.

Park Hours

Park hours usually include dawn to dusk. Check signs at each park for hours.
